## RECITALS


1. PEAK is responsible for the content, revision and review of this document.
2. This PCD is applicable to Qualified Providers.

## PURPOSE

1. This PCD is to provide guidance to Qualified Providers for the administration of Epinephrine (via EpiPen auto-injector) and oral Diphenhydramine to patients suspected of experiencing an anaphylactic reaction.

## PROCEDURE

1. For patients who meet the Indications For Use criteria for Epinephrine and/or Diphenhydramine in the Anaphylaxis Management: Epinephrine & Diphenhydramine Protocols Pre-Administration Checklist; **AND**
2. For patients where the Contraindications of Use (Epinephrine and/or Diphenhydramine) are ruled out; **AND**
3. For patients where **ALL** Conditions of Use are achieved.
4. The Qualified Provider may administer Epinephrine (via EpiPen) and oral Diphenhydramine to patients suspected of experiencing an anaphylactic reaction in accordance with the protocol/procedures outlined in the APTP Training Manual.
